Communication between home and academy is vital for the education of our students. The procedures set forth at Blessed Sacrament Catholic Academy are as follows:

1. Parents are expected to attend all orientations and report card conferences.
2. Parents are invited to communicate with the academy through written notes, phone calls to the office, academy e-mail accounts, and Remind.
3. Parents are expected to read all memos sent home by the teachers or principal.
4. Teachers will communicate through written notes, phone calls, e-mail, Remind, and conferences.
5. Unless it is an emergency all conferences should be scheduled in advance.



ADMISSIONS POLICY

STATEMENT OF NONDISCRIMINATION

Blessed Sacrament Catholic Academy admits students of any race, color, national and ethnic origin to all rights, privileges, programs and activities generally accorded or made available to students at the school. It does not discriminate on the basis of race, color, national or ethnic origin in the administration of its educational and admission policies, athletic programs or other school programs.

I. Documentation

A. For All New Registrants

- 1) An original birth certificate
- 2) A baptismal certificate or dedication certificate (if applicable)
- 3) An updated immunization record
- 4) Social Security Card
- 5) Registration fee
- 6) All new registrants are required to provide proof of a current and complete physical examination by a health professional.
- 7) Proof of residence

B. Grades 2 – 7 (Grade 8 registration is on a very limited basis)

- 1) Copy of most recent report card
- 2) Copy of standardized tests
- 3) A copy of an IEP if applicable.
- 4) A letter from the non-public school stating that all financial obligations have been met.

II. Registration Procedures

A. Pre-Kindergarten/Kindergarten

- 1) The child must be present at registration for an interview with the prospective teacher.
- 2) Kindergarten children must return on an assigned day for testing.
- 3) Parents will be given a medical form from the NYC Department of Health.
 - a) All new registrants are required to provide proof of a current and complete physical examination by a health professional.
- 4) Accepted students are required to attend an orientation session to be scheduled by the teacher.

B. Grades 1 – 7 (8)

- 1) The student should be present at the time of registration.
- 2) The principal will review the report card and testing results. An interview will be conducted in some cases.
 - a) If warranted, some students will be required to return for testing or attend a recognized summer school prior to final acceptance.



- b) If necessary, students may be required to repeat the present grade.
- 3) As above, a medical exam is required.

III. Religion

Blessed Sacrament philosophy, based on the tenets of the Roman Catholic Church. While we welcome students of other faiths into our school community, we do have certain requirements concerning religion.

A. Requirements for students registered in Blessed Sacrament Catholic Academy

- 1) All students must be physically present and actively participate in the following:
 - a) Classroom religion lessons including discussions and tests
 - b) Mass with the exception of receiving communion
 - c) Prayer services, whether in Church or school
 - d) Recitation of daily prayers and hymn singing
 - e) Religious plays, presentations or skits
 - f) Religion projects
 - g) Virtues and values lessons and projects

Any student who does not or cannot meet the above requirements because of religious convictions or for any reason is subject to dismissal from Blessed Sacrament Catholic Academy.

- B. Catholic parents have the responsibility to see that their families attend Mass on Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation and are active in parish life.

IV. Other

A. Parents of registrants must agree to attend all orientation, general parent meetings and Parent – Teacher Conferences throughout the year.

Parents of students in the sacramental programs are also required to attend Sacramental Preparation Meetings.

B. Tuition is collected in ten equal payments beginning in July. All financial obligations must be met by June 1st. All payments must be made by check or money order. Please see the attached Financial Obligation Policy.

C. Parents must agree to meet all financial obligations including the support of fundraising efforts.

- 1) There are mandatory fundraising events each school year.
- 2) Such support may entail attendance at fundraising events as well as a monetary contribution.

D. In the case of divorced or separated parents all custodial issues must be discussed with the principal.



V. Acceptance into Blessed Sacrament Catholic Academy

The decision to accept or reject a registration application is the responsibility of the principal in consultation with the Board.

Rejections will be made in person or by mail. Parents may request a conference with the principal and the Board to appeal such rejections.

BLESSED SACRAMENT CATHOLIC ACADEMY FINANCIAL OBLIGATIONS

General Tuition Policy

When families enroll their children at Blessed Sacrament Catholic Academy they agree that they will be held solely responsible for paying the tuition rate.

Tuition payment is due on the 15th of the month or the next school day.

All payments must come directly to the Academy's office on the second floor.

All fees must be paid on time. All fees are non-refundable.

Delinquent Accounts

Bounced checks are charged the \$30 bank fee, and all subsequent tuition payments must be by money order.

If tuition and/or fees are in arrears for more than 30 calendar days, the families receive a letter of warning.

If tuition and/or fees are in arrears for more than 60 calendar days, the families must appear for a hearing before the finance committee of the board and may incur a \$25 penalty fee.

If tuition and/or fees are in arrears for more than 90 calendar days, the account will be sent to a collections agency.

The board will come to a binding decision on an appropriate course of action after 90 days delinquency.

Families cannot be granted a seat for the upcoming school year until all financial obligations are met.

If tuition and/or fees are in arrears at any point in the academic year, the report card, state test results, diploma, and transcripts will be withheld until the debt is satisfied.

Financial Aid Requests

Families with payment concerns can apply annually to TADS for assistance. The board will not consider any financial arrangements unless the family has first exhausted all possible financial aid opportunities.

Before a family finds itself in arrears, the parents or guardians are encouraged to contact the principal for a referral to the finance committee of the board.

Any family seeking assistance must come prepared with documentation including but not limited to W2, pay stubs, bank statements, lease, and any other pertinent information.



Financial arrangements made with the board will only apply for the present academic year unless otherwise indicated by the board members. Any assistance decision from the board is final.

Fundraising

Families must agree to meet all financial obligations including the support of fundraising efforts.

There are fundraising event each school year which will be announced to families.

After School Program

The After School Program has a separate and distinct payment schedule from the Academy's tuition plan. If there is any outstanding tuition balance from the Academy, students will not be permitted to attend the After School Program until all debts are satisfied.

The Board of Blessed Sacrament Catholic Academy reserves the right to modify its tuition and financial policy at any time.

ACADEMIC POLICY

I. Curriculum

Blessed Sacrament Catholic Academy follows the Next Generation Standards set forth by New York State and sanctioned by the Diocese of Brooklyn.

It is the responsibility of the principal, faculty and staff with the cooperation and support of the parents to meet the educational needs of our students.

II. Homework/Individual or Group Projects

Homework either written, study or both will be assigned daily.

A. Student Responsibility

- 1) It is each student's responsibility to copy homework assignments, take home the necessary books, etc., complete the work neatly, correctly and on time.

B. Parent Responsibility

- 1) Parents should provide a quiet space and a specified homework time.
- 2) Children should be encouraged to do their best work.
- 3) Completed homework should be checked. Parents of children in Pre-Kindergarten through Sixth Grade are to sign all written work.

C. Failure to complete homework, projects etc.

- 1) Homework and projects are factors in the Report Card grade. Repeated failure to complete assignments will result in a lowering of a grade.
- 2) Each teacher also has the discretion to impose detention or other sanctions for incomplete or missing assignments.



III. Evaluation

A. Components

Student evaluation is based on teacher developed, book and standardized tests, classwork, homework, projects, classroom participation and teacher observation.

B. Diocesan Standardized Testing (Terra Nova)

- 1) Grades 3 through 8
- 2) Results will be reported to the parent

C. NYS Testing

Any student who fails to meet the State reference point must receive remediation.

- 1) ELA Grades 4, 6 and 8
- 2) Math Grades 4, 6 and 8
- 3) ESPET (Science) Grades 4 and 8

D. Reporting

- 1) Interim Progress Reports (Grades 1 – 8)
 - a) These will be issued 3 times during the school year (once each trimester) to those students with deficiencies.
 - b) They must be signed and returned to the teacher.
- 2) Report Cards (Grades Pre-K – 8)
 - a) These will be issued in December and March at a Parent – Teacher Conference. Only parents or adult guardians will be given the Report Card. (Non-English speaking parents are asked to bring an interpreter.)
 - b) The final Report Card will be issued to the student on the last day of school, if all financial obligations have been met.

A. Grading Code

Blessed Sacrament Catholic Academy uses the standard Report Cards provided by the Diocese of Brooklyn.

The grading code differs according to academic level (Pre-K/Kindergarten, Primary, Intermediate, and Junior High). Samples of the Report Card and its particular grading code are available in the School Office for parental review.

B. Trimester Academic Awards

Honors are awarded to those students who achieve academic excellence or are striving to achieve it. However, the Report Card grade is not the only criteria. Students in grades 1 through 4 with failing or a 1 or 2 in Personal Progress, Homework and Effort are ineligible to receive an academic award. Students in grades 5 through 8 who receive a 1 or 2 in Conduct, Effort,



Homework and Personal Progress are ineligible to receive academic awards. The Spanish grade is included in the overall average.

C. Perfect Attendance

Certificates of perfect attendance are awarded to those students who are neither absent nor tardy nor have missed any part of the school day during each trimester.

D. Summer School Policy

- a) Teachers may either strongly recommend or require attendance at summer school for promotion.
- b) Students must return with documentation from a recognized summer program or certified tutor.

E. Retention Policy

- a) The decision to retain a student is made by the classroom teacher and principal in consultation with the parents.
- b) In most cases the possibility of retention will be stated on the March Report Card and be discussed at the Parent – Teacher Conference.
- c) Parents will be notified in writing of the intent to retain. Parents have the right to request a Parent – Teacher – Principal Conference to express their concerns. However, the final decision is the responsibility of the Principal.



SAFETY AND SECURITY

I. Crisis Procedures

A. Crisis Management Plan

Blessed Sacrament Catholic Academy has developed a Crisis Management Plan as required by the Diocese of Brooklyn Department of Education.

This document is available in the School Office for parental review.

B. Fire/Evacuation Drills

Safety drills will be conducted on a regular schedule. The rules will be explained to the students in advance.

Any student who does not follow the rules will be subject to the following:

- 1) 1st offense – The teacher will speak to the student.
- 2) 2nd offence – The student will be sent to the principal.
- 3) 3rd offense – The student's parent will be called.
A conference will be scheduled.

C. Cellular Phones

Students may bring cell phones to school for reasons of safety and security. They may not be used to make calls during the school day.

Students are required to hand in their cell phones to the teacher when they arrive at school. The collected cell phones will be sent to the school office for safe keeping. The phones will be returned at dismissal.

If a student is caught with a cell phone, it will be confiscated and sent to the office. The confiscated phone will **ONLY BE RELEASED TO THE PARENT. IT WILL NOT BE RETURNED TO THE STUDENT.**

Cell phones may be carried on a student's person during a school trip.

II. General Procedures

A. Parental Building Access

All visitors to Blessed Sacrament Catholic Academy are to use the entrance closest to Ridgewood Avenue. They are to go directly to the Office. Parents may not go directly to the classroom for any reason.

B. Early Dismissal to Parent or Designated Guardian

Early dismissal should be an infrequent event. However, should you find it necessary to pick up your child early, please do the following:



- 1) Send a note to the classroom teacher and/or call the School Office.
- 2) Go to the School and sign out your child.

C. Student Arrival

Students are to be in their classroom at 8:00 A.M.

It is your responsibility to see that your child(ren) arrive(s) on time. Persistent lateness may result in detention in Grades 3 – 8. Any child arriving in the classroom after 8:05 AM will be marked late.

D. Student Dismissal

Grades Pre-K and Kindergarten will be dismissed at 2:45 on regular days and 12:00 on half days.

Grades 1- 8 will be dismissed at 3:00 on regular days and 12:15 on half days.

It is your responsibility as a parent to see that your child(ren) is picked up on time. If you or your representative have to be called more than three times, the following will result:

- a) Your child will be sent to the After School Program to wait. There will be a charge of \$2.50 for every 15 minutes of waiting time. This charge will be added to your tuition.

If someone other than the usual designated adult is going to pick up your child(ren), you must notify the classroom teacher or the Office in advance.

Please note that once a student enters the schoolyard, building, grounds or Church, he/she may not leave without proper adult supervision.

E. Student Photos

Photos of students will be taken and displayed in classrooms, hallways, school website etc. Parents will be asked to sign and return a diocesan authorization permitting the academy to do so. If you do not sign this form, your child will not be included in the yearly class photo.

III. Code of Conduct

Our code of conduct is based on respect. We wish to foster respect for oneself, for others and for property.

The following policies address conduct at school and on school grounds. However, we consider school functions and trips as an extension of school. Therefore, the same rules and regulations apply to those situations.

A. Classroom/Hallways/Stairs/Lavatories/Lunchroom/School Hall/Church/Etc.

The following behaviors are among those not permitted:

- 1) Students may not scream, curse, or use abusive or disrespectful language toward any adult or other students.



- 2) Students may not fight/hit. They may not strike a teacher or any adult. They may not push or shove anyone.
- 3) Students may not deface or destroy school or another student's property in any way.
- 4) Students may not take any item which does not belong to them.
- 5) Students may not run unless participating in a supervised event.
- 6) Students may not chew gum at school or at any school function.
- 7) Students may not bring large sums of money or any valuables such as jewelry, personal items, electronic toys, cd players, iPods, MP3 players, etc. The school is not responsible for loss or damage of such items.
- 8) Students must obey all lunchroom rules.

Minor infractions will be dealt with by the teacher. In case of repeated or major infractions, the student will be sent to the principal and his/her parent(s) will be notified by phone and/or writing. A conference will follow. That conference may result in suspension or possible expulsion. In addition, parents are responsible for the cost of any and all damaged or lost property.

B. School Yard

The students may not run, push, shove, play tag, play ball or throw objects of any kind. As in the previous section, they may not be physically or verbally abusive. Students may not damage property, such as cars.

- 1) Failure to follow the rules may result in loss of privileges, detention or possible suspension.

C. Playground

- 1) Each teacher will set his/her safety rules which are age appropriate.
- 2) Failure to follow the rules may result in a time out or suspension of playground privileges. The length of which will be determined by the teacher.

D. After School Program

Registered students are to go directly to the school basement at dismissal. They are not permitted to leave the school building for any reason without adult supervision.

The After School staff will establish rules and consequences for infractions which are appropriate to their setting. Repeated failure to follow the rules may result in expulsion from the program.



E. Weapons Policy

No weapon, real or toy, or weapon-like object is to be carried on a student's person or schoolbag, displayed, brought onto school property, a school trip or function.

Failure to follow the weapons policy will result in:

- 1) The object will immediately be confiscated.
- 2) The student and confiscated item will be brought to the principal.
- 3) The student's parent(s) will be called and/or notified in writing.
- 4) The student will remain in the Office until his/her parent arrives.
- 5) The result of the conference may result in counseling, suspension or expulsion.
- 6) If warranted the NYC Police Department will be notified.

F. Substance Abuse Policy (Alcohol/Drugs/Smoking)

Any student found to be drinking alcohol, taking, selling or buying illegal drugs or smoking cigarettes of any kind or found with any of these on his/her person will be subject to the procedures set forth in the Weapons Policy.

G. Bullying Policy

Blessed Sacrament Catholic Academy will follow the revised bullying policy set forth by the Diocese of Brooklyn. A bullying incident form will be completed whenever bullying is reported to or observed by the faculty, staff, or administration. Parents are encouraged to report any possible incidents to the academy.

The official Diocesan Bullying Policy is available to parents in the school office and the Academy website.

ACCEPTABLE USE POLICY FOR COMPUTERS

All students and parents will be required to read and sign our Acceptable Use Policy for Computer and the Internet. Students who post photos or videos taken in Blessed Sacrament Catholic Academy, anywhere on school property or on a field trip will be suspended. Posting inappropriate photos will result in expulsion. Cyber bullying will result in suspension or expulsion for a repeated offense.

IV. Medical Issues

Any student who has a fever, digestive upset or is vomiting should not be sent to school. In addition, Pre-K and Kindergarten students with severe colds (hacking coughs, excessive sneezing, and very runny noses) should be kept at home to prevent the spread of the virus.

If a student becomes ill at school, the situation will be assessed. (School personnel do not diagnose.) In most cases a parent or guardian will be called.



All students returning to school after an absence must bring a signed absence note, which gives the reason for the absence.

A. Parent Notification

All students are required to have an Emergency Card on file.
Please notify us immediately of any and all changes.

B. Medication

1) The faculty and staff are not permitted to administer medication to the students. If your child(ren) must take medication, you or an adult designated by you must come to school to administer it.

C. Chronic Conditions

The school must be informed in writing of any chronic condition your child(ren) might have. These include, but are not limited to, asthma, diabetes, and allergies. If your child (ren)'s condition requires any dietary limitations, you must notify the school in writing.

D. Immunization Record and Medical Forms

Blessed Sacrament Catholic Academy follows the guidelines of the NYC Department of Health. We reserve the right to exclude any student who does not meet such guidelines.

SCHOOL REGULATIONS

Dress Code – Kindergarten

All Kindergarten students are required to wear the academy gym uniform and sneakers.

Dress Code – Grades 1 – 8

Parents are responsible to see that the rules are followed. Parents will be notified of uniform infractions. In some cases a parent or guardian may be required to bring the proper attire to school.



A. Boy's Attire

- 1) Navy blue uniform trousers (no Dockers, jeans or faded pants) with a black belt.
 - a) Pants must be worn at the waist not below.
- 2) Grades 1 to 5 – Light blue (long or short sleeve) golf shirt with the official Blessed Sacrament embroidered school logo will be the year round uniform for Grades 1 to 5. (NO dress shirts and ties.)
- 3) Grades 6 and 7 – Light blue dress shirt (long or short sleeve) with a navy blue tie.
- 4) Grade 8 – White dress shirt (long or short sleeve) with a navy blue tie.
- 5) Black oxford shoes with black or navy socks.
 - a) No sneakers or boots.
 - b) Shoes must be laced and tied at all times.
- 6) Navy blue uniform sweater with the school logo.
- 7) Hair may not touch the top of the shirt collar.

Please note that the following are not permitted:

Pony tails, shaved heads, mushroom or etched cuts, mullets, mat tops, corn-rows, weaves, Mohawks, man buns, spikes, extensions, colored/dyed hair, facial hair or long sideburns, do rags, headbands, earrings, tattoos, body piercing, or flip flops.

Boys are not permitted to wear hats in the building during the day or at any academy function.

B. Girl's Attire

- 1) Plaid full front uniform jumper (Grades 1-5)
 - a) Grades 6, 7 and 8 wear a gray uniform wrap around skort which must touch the top of knee with attached matching shorts and a blue sweater vest
- 2) Light blue uniform blouse with Peter Pan collar and plaid uniform cross tie
 - a) Grade 8 wears a white uniform blouse
- 3) Black oxford shoes with tie or buckle for Grades 1 - 5
 - a) No sneakers or boots
 - b) No platforms in any grade
 - c) No heels higher than 1½ inches
- 4) Navy blue socks or tights (Gray for Grades 6, 7 & 8)
- 5) Navy blue school sweater with the school logo

Please note that the following are not permitted:

Hoop or dangling earrings, make up, colored/dyed hair, bare feet (no socks), flip flops, nail polish, tattoos, body piercing, or any inappropriate jewelry, including gel bracelets.

C. Summer Attire (September – October 1 May 15 – June 30) (Optional) Grades 1-5

- 1) Navy blue uniform shorts or skort may be worn instead of the trousers (boys) or jumper/skort (girls).
- 2) The regular uniform shirt or blouse or the light blue golf style uniform shirt may be worn.

**D. Winter Attire (Optional)**

- 1) Navy blue uniform pants worn with the uniform blouse and school sweater.

E. Gym Attire

- 1) Depending upon the season either the navy uniform shorts and tee shirt or navy uniform sweat suit may be worn.
- 2) Tie sneakers are to be worn.

Please note that any student not in the proper gym uniform may be excluded from participating in gym class.

F. Dress Down/School Functions

- 1) Casual but appropriate clothes are permitted.

Please note that in addition to the prohibitions listed in the previous sections, students may not wear:

Muscle shirts, low cut tops, tank tops, tight jeans or pants, shirts or pants with offensive or vulgar language, miniskirts, shorts or any clothing that reveals the midriff or navel.

Infractions of the Dress Down Rules:

1st offense – verbal warning

2nd offense – parent will be called

3rd offense – loss of Dress Down privilege

Miscellaneous

- 1) GUM CHEWING IS PROHIBITED AT ALL TIMES INCLUDING LUNCH AND ALL SCHOOL FUNCTIONS.
- 2) Expensive and extensive jewelry should not be worn.
 - a) The school is not responsible for the loss of valuables.
- 3) Neither temporary nor permanent tattoos are allowed.
- 4) Electronic devices or pagers are not permitted.
- 5) Only the navy blue school sweater may be worn in the building.
- 6) Boots must be removed and replaced with school shoes.
- 7) Body piercing is forbidden.
- 8) Schoolbags with wheels are strongly discouraged.

Absence Policy

- A) Each time a student returns to school after an absence he/she must bring a signed note stating the reason for the absence.
- B) Parents of children absent for illegal reasons, such as vacations or day trips, etc. are responsible for any work missed. Teachers are not required to provide work in advance.



- C) Parents of students in Grades 6, 7 and 8 are required to call the Office (718-235-4863) each time their child is absent.
- D) Parents of students in Grades Pre-K through 6 are required to call the Office (718-235-4863) if their child is absent more than three days.

V. Inclement Weather

In the case of extremely inclement weather, listen to the radio for announcements of Catholic Academy closings. If public schools in NYC or the schools in the Diocese of Brooklyn are closed, Blessed Sacrament Catholic Academy will be closed. Please do not call the rectory or academy for information. If Blessed Sacrament is closed for inclement weather or for an emergency, parents will receive a message on Remind.

VI. Detention Policy

- A. Certain infractions may require a student to serve detention.
 - 1) Each teacher will inform you of his/her individual classroom detention policy.
 - 2) Parents will be notified in advance.

VII. Use of School Office Telephone

A. Student use of the Office telephone is limited to emergencies. Forgotten gym clothes, books, homework, etc. do not constitute an emergency.

VIII. Field Trip Policy

- A. Field trips are intended to serve an educational purpose and students are strongly encouraged to participate.
 - 1) The choice of chaperones is determined by the teacher. Chaperones must be Virtus trained
 - 2) Students may be denied the right to attend for failing to meet academic or behavior standards.
 - 3) Blessed Sacrament Catholic Academy accepts no liability for harm if caused by circumstances beyond the school's burden of "due care".
 - 4) Written parental permission is required.
 - 5) Regular or gym uniform may be required on some field trips.



IX. Extra-Curricular Activities

- A. Blessed Sacrament Catholic Academy offers several extra-curricular activities:
- Band – This activity is offered to students from first grade through eighth grade. Parents are responsible for the cost of this activity.
 - Choral – This is a free activity offered to students in grades 3, 4, and 5. Students are expected to follow the academy’s discipline code.
 - Fitness – This free activity is offered to students in grades 6, 7, and 8. Girls and boys meet on separate afternoons. They are expected to follow the academy’s discipline code to remain in the program.
 - Robotics – Students in grades 5, 6, and 7 participate in this program through invitation only. Students are chosen by academic achievement, behavior, and attitude toward learning.
